Building and Grounds

- Dehumidifier replacement has been evaluated but has not yet begun
- The Parks Department/DPW has beautified the library grounds, completing extensive landscaping, and allowing more light to enter the building.
- Two areas of grass between the parking spacing on the street side were removed by DPW. This will provide at least two more parking spaces and will make plowing easier.

A representative of the Capital Improvements Committee and I discussed the Capital Improvement Requests and their priority. I sought recommendations from other Massachusetts libraries for recommendations for artists to paint murals in the Children's area and the Story Hour room, and received several recommendations.
