Building and Grounds

During a rainstorm, there was some roof leakage near the stairs. DPW arranged for a roofing company to repair the area affected, and there have been no problems since.

DPW offered to paint the interior of the Library. They have almost finished the entire lower level, with the exception of the Makerspace which had been recently painted. The rooms look wonderful, much brighter than they were previously. DPW plans to begin work on the upper level on Friday, February 10th, while the library is closed.

We have been having some issues with the heating control system. A technician came out and repaired one zone, and DPW and I have been working with the company to adjust other sections of the heating system.
